YOU'RE COMPLICATING THE NARRATIVES WHEN YOU...

1.LISTEN DIFFERENTLY

• Double check to ensure you understand your source's perspective so you can build trust and get more accurate answers.

• Listen for clues or "signposts" (words like "always" or "never") and inquire when you hear them. That helps your source to go deeper and share more.



3.EMBRACE COMPLEXITY

• Acknowledge the complexity of a controversy. It makes audiences more open to learning about different viewpoints.

• Look at the same issue in a different geographic location or time in history. That helps your audience to broaden their understanding of the problem.

2.GO BENEATH THE PROBLEM

- Ask different types of questions that go beneath the issue to get to people's deeper motivations, not just
- Keep it personal with your questions so you get people off their usual talking points.

4.COUNTER CONFIRMATION BIAS

- Host inclusive community convenings for your audience. It's an opportunity to build relationships
- Use graphics to help explain facts connected to divisive issues so people are more likely to consider information they don't want to hear.
